In an interview, Knight said, "I was very honored to be able to create something special for this important chairty event. The chain wallet I'm donating is a new shape that is patterned to look like a holster profile. In the past I've made very traditional looking chain wallets, I wanted to add some "kick ass" to the style. I've started using kangaroo leather for the interior and adding skulls into the design. My use of top grade American cowhide hasn't changed. Start with the best tooling leather and you are guaranteed a top notch product that will last for many years."

"I was visiting a client in New York a couple of winters ago and spent time at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. I found myself drawn to the Egyptian exhibit with the hieroglyphs and intricate designs on jewelry.
